We welcomed the new year with a number of celebrations. In January over 40 members and friends got connected in a tasty Dim Sum lunch at Chinatown. Together with the sale of homemade traditional cakes, the Chinese New Year fundraising event raised a total of £839 (after expenses). The 2022 Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Association resumed as an inperson format on 4thFebruary, after two years of virtual meetings. The event also marked our milestone of 35 years in community service. The number of attendances might be significantly lower than pre-COVID time, those who could make it would have agreed that the day was packed with delicious food and fun activities suitable for all ages.







Annual General Meeting, 4 Feb

Looking back, 2022 would have been a year of reflection and creativity. It has been a challenging 17 months since the Centre reopened in August 2021. While we are delighted to have attracted new members joining the community, the number of returning members to date is about 35% of pre-COVID time. The Association's finances have been badly hit by the loss of income from donations and charitable activities as a result of its slow recovery. Overall, an operating loss of £5,113 was incurred for the 12 months to 31 March 2022.
